A BENEFIT EVENT by Noemi Preiswerk-Aymonod

Heini Meier, the internationally renowned dog whisperer, was at English Center Basel. TeleBasel reported on the event in their "Was lauft" program.

On February 1st, a special event for the benefit of Hundehilfe Mittelitalien took place at English

Karin Braun, president of the fundraising charity, was able to persuade Heini Meier, the internationally renowned dog whisperer, to come to Basel and give a lecture on how best to communicate with one's dog.

Heini Meier, demonstrating his training practices, has been shown on various television broadcasting channels such as SRF, RTL and Sat1. He is well known for his movies, "Der Hundeflüsterer" and "Der mit den Hunden spricht" and he has also written a very interesting book: "Menschenkunde für Hunde, Hundekunde für Menschen"

Heini Meier's educational practice is based on correct communication. without emotions. A dog owner has to "tell" the dog in the right way what is expected. This will result in the correct reaction from the dog.

Mr. Meier has trained thousands of difficult dogs and enabled the dog owners to have a relaxed coexistence with their four-legged friends. His training methods have saved many dog's lives because, when dog owners had not been able to handle their dogs any more he showed them how to solve their problem.

At the event on Feb 1st, about 70 people followed with great interest Heini Meier's lecture about his training methods. For about an hour after the lecture, Mr. Meier answered many questions of the dog owners who were present and gave them advice on how to handle the problems with their dogs. After that, he signed his book for those who wanted to buy it.

With heartfelt gratitude, we have to mention that Heini Meier came to give this lecture for free.

The whole income of the evening was for the benefit of "Hundehilfe Mittelitalien" which is supporting Lia Campriani's exceptional dog

shelter near Peruggia in Italy where about 100 to 140 dogs are cared for with love, fed and provided with medicine if necessary. This is a big exception in Italy, as most of the official dog shelters (called "canili") are hells for the poor -- often starving -dogs which have to stay there. mostly for the rest of their lives, with a minimum of medical care.

After the lecture, many guests accepted the invitation of English Center Basel to join an Apéro on the 5th floor. On this occasion, many conversations were held, mainly on the subject of dogs.

English Center Basel as well as "Hundehilfe Mittelitalien" received a lot of positive feedback on this
